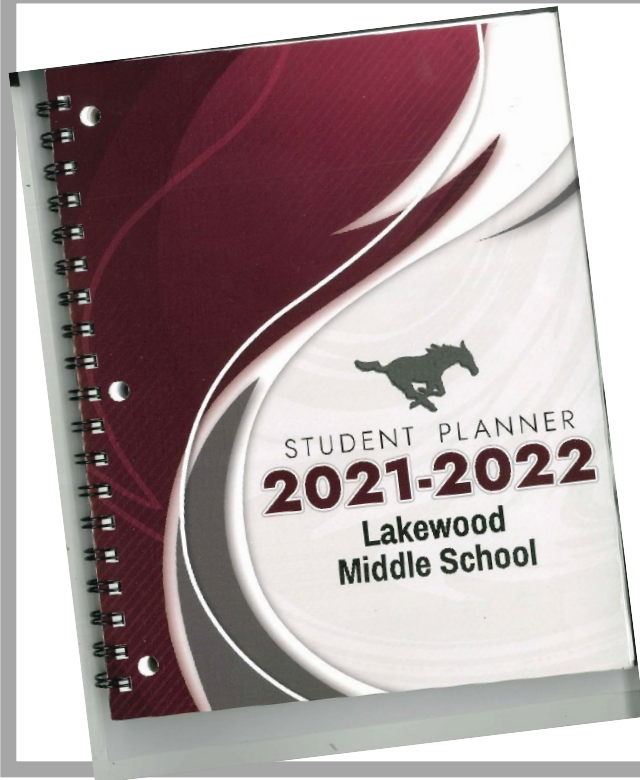

When arriving at an entrance door to the school at the beginning of the day, students will turn off their cell phones/electronic devices and put these items in their pocket/bag/purse.

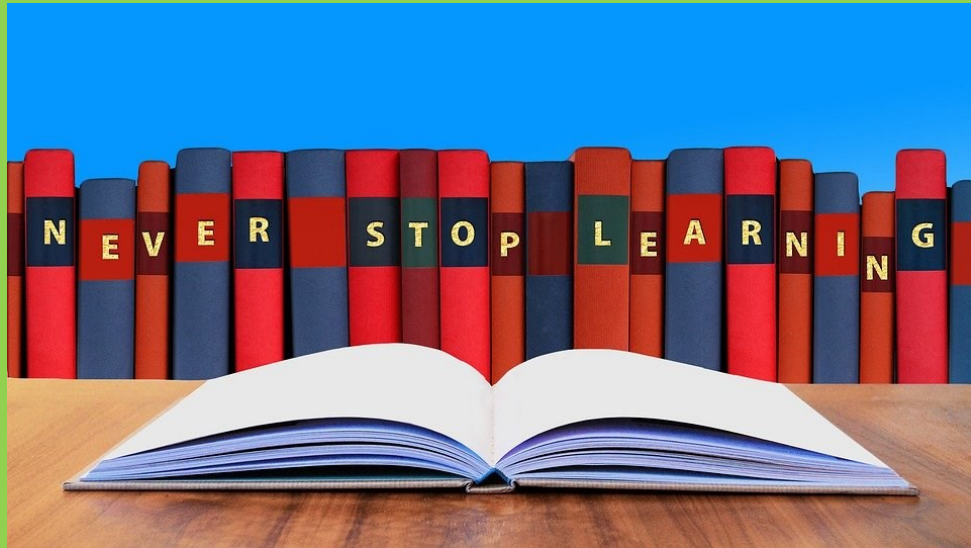

- ♦ We will listen to understand and value the speaker, and not just to respond.

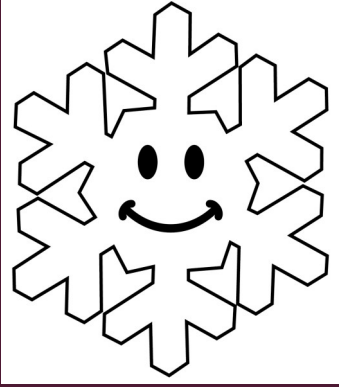
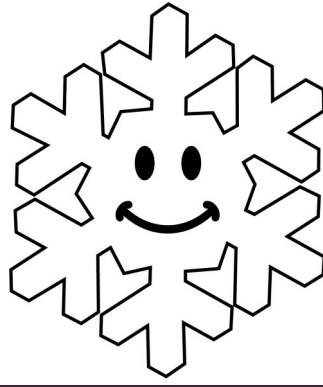
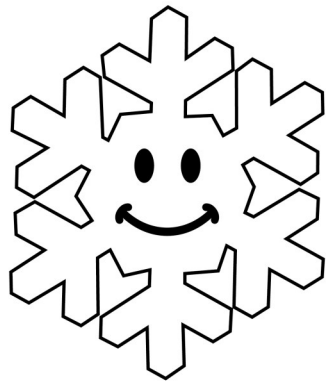
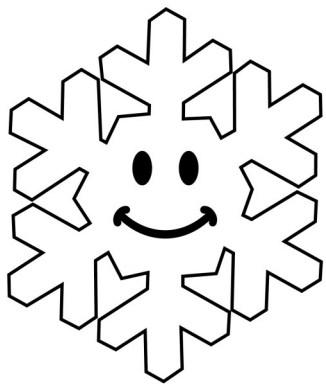
